#### Important Notes:

- A total of 124 credits is required to earn the BA in English Education.
- At least two departments or programs must be included in each Breadth group. Up to 3 credits from each of the University Breadth categories may be used to simultaneously satisfy the College's Breadth Requirements. Anything more, including cross-listed courses, counts as electives.
- No more than 45 credits with the ENGL prefix, including cross-listed courses, but excluding ENGL491 and ENGL492, may be counted toward the total required for the degree.
- The English Education program requires students to have a 2.75 overall GPA and a 3.0 GPA in the major to be eligible for student teaching.
- Students must earn a C- or better in all required ENGL, EDUC, and LING courses.
- Both EDUC413 (4 cr.) and EDUC419 (3 cr.) require field placements and therefore should be taken before junior year – and not at the same time. They also require clearances; clearances require students to meet strict deadlines the semester before the course is taken.
